SUMMARY

The Department of Political Science is defined by first-rate research, exceptional teaching, and steadfast service to our local, regional, national, and international communities. With 36 full-time faculty, 459 undergraduate legal studies majors, 772 undergraduate political science majors, 70 Ph.D. students, and more than 11,000 alumni, our reach is vast and our accomplishments many.

Our faculty have been recognized around the globe for their expertise, published important research in new books and articles in some of the leading international journals, and demonstrated their commitment to teaching again and again in the classroom. Our students have won national championships and fellowships, been inducted into countless honors societies, attended and presented original research at conferences across the US, and become truly engaged students of legal studies and political science.

This report highlights some of the research, teaching, and service conducted through our Department and underscores the impact our faculty, staff, and students have on the University, as well as the larger state, national, and federal communities.

POINTS OF PRIDE

First-Rate Research

- Sheldon Goldman was appointed Distinguished Professor.
- Brenda Bushouse won the Virginia Hodgkinson Research Prize for her book *Universal Preschool: Policy Change, Stability and the Pew Charitable Trusts*.

- We started a new Graduate Research Initiative Program to fund exciting graduate student research that cuts across traditional political science subfields.
- Graduate Student Melinda Tarsi was awarded the Harry Middleton Fellowship in Presidential Studies; the Arthur M. Schlesinger, Jr. Research Fellowship; and the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute Research Support Grant.
- We launched UMass Poll, a polling center combining cutting-edge Internet polling technology with leading expertise in political science.

Exceptional Teaching

- Three faculty and two teaching assistants won Student Choice awards for their work with first-year students.
- In partnership with UMass Summer College, we launched two new, college-level political science courses for high school students.
- We introduced a new Accelerated Master's Degree in Political Science and will accept our first applications in October 2012.

- Jane Fountain was appointed to the Governor's Innovation Council.
- Maryann Barakso served as President of the Women and Politics section of the American Political Science Association.
- Leah Wing organized an Art of Conflict Transformation Event Series, bringing international scholars and never-before shown political textiles from eight countries to campus.

It allows them to complete a bachelor's and master's degree in a total of five years -- faster than in traditional MA programs.

As a self-proclaimed "student of politics," PhD student Melinda R. Tarsi chose UMass because she "wanted to be in a department where faculty would encourage scholarship across traditional subfield lines and be open to different methodological approaches." Her research -- a blend of American politics, political history, and civil-military relations -- is answering important questions about the development of civil and military welfare states. Her preliminary research has already been recognized through the Harry Middleton Fellowship in Presidential Studies; the Arthur M. Schlesinger, Jr. Research Fellowship; and the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute Research Support Grant.

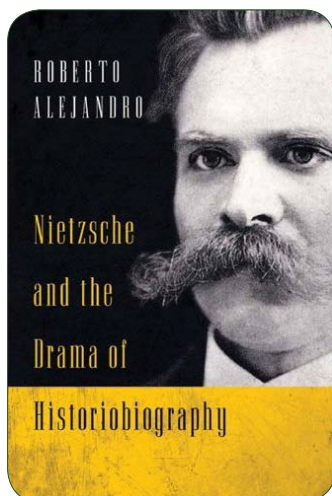


THE LAW OF DEMOCRACY

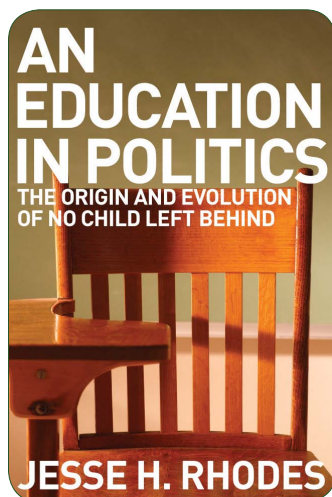
“The regulation of American democracy is perhaps the area of constitutional law where judges have been most innovative in crafting transformative and anti-originalist rules for modern politics,” says Professor Nathaniel Persily, the Charles Keller Beekman Professor of Law and Political Science and Director of the Center for Law and Politics at Columbia Law School. Professor Persily, a leading expert on Congressional redistricting and founder of DrawCongress.org, addressed this “law of democracy” in the Department’s 7th Annual Dean Alfange Jr. Lecture in American Constitutionalism. The annual lecture, named in honor of Professor Emeritus Dean Alfange Jr., features prominent jurists, scholars, and commentators of constitutionalism and constitutional law. 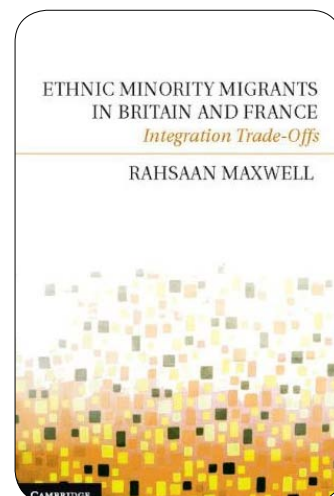
