

# UMass Courses Approved for Five College IR Certificate

## Spring 2018

The UMass Amherst courses below meet the requirements for the Five College IR Certificate.  
Students may also take approved courses at any of the Five Colleges.

**IMPORTANT: Only courses for which a student receives a grade of B or better will count toward the certificate.**

**REQUIREMENT 1**—Introductory world politics (contemporary political relations among states).

**REQUIREMENT 2**—Global institutions or problems, such as international law, transnational organizations, development, the history of imperialism, arms control and disarmament, the origins of war, diminishing resources, international threats to the environment, hunger, and conduct of diplomacy.

**REQUIREMENT 3**—The development and/or functioning of the international financial and commercial system.

**REQUIREMENT 4**—A history course concerning the period between 1789 and 1945 which pays substantial attention to the development of the international system.

**REQUIREMENT 5**—Contemporary American foreign policy, including both its substance and the policymaking system.

**REQUIREMENT 6**—Fluency in a contemporary foreign language through the second- year college level or its equivalent. Must either complete four semesters of college language or provide evidence of fluency through testing or transcripts from foreign language- speaking school. (Examples: Arabic, Chinese, Danish, Dutch, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Swedish.)

**REQUIREMENT 7**—Area studies: Two courses on the politics, economy, and/or societies of foreign areas. At least one of these must involve the study of one or more underdeveloped nations outside the U.S. and Western Europe.
